"Officers Mess - a note from the LSHM Board"

Hello fellow historical gamers! Many of you may know I'm the "Sarge" for Bolt Action tournaments and activities in San Antonio. I took over from Will Easton last September and I have had a blast getting to know many of you. Just a few short notes about me in order to let you know that our beloved Bolt Action future in central Texas is in good hands (at least until someone better comes along). I'm a retired Army Lieutenant Colonel that served for 28 years in Air Defense. Before that I was a cadet at New Mexico Military Institute where I met my good friend Charles Torok. I started playing wargames in 1972 at the age of 7 with the board game called "Panzer Leader" and I have never stopped. At NMMI I was the president of the wargamers club for awhile. I'm a long time WWII military history buff, and I have travelled the world to walk on some famous battle grounds.

With my Army experience, and as a result of my military studies, I'm endeavoring to bring even more realism to our Bolt Action gaming experience. My battle reports that I post on Facebook from time-to-time are based on historical footnotes and therefore become historical fiction. For tournament design (including games I organize with Casey Pittman from Austin), I provide historical reference and relevance. That means I provide a historical scenario to which we fight a tournament battle. When I hold a tournament, I like to hear a historical reference or theme to your battle group (as the Brits called them) for extra victory points. This compels you to read up and study just a bit about your Table of Organization and Equipment (TO&E). Soon, I will start to add historical figures and other special rules into regular game play and tournaments for a bit flavor.

Tank War play has started and is in full swing. I will hold a Tank War (TW) Tournament in the future. I have discovered that it goes quicker than regular reinforced platoons play so if you haven't put a TW PLT together yet, start thinking about it! In conjunction with TW, I have started a crew skill campaign. Several people have already earned crew skills for their tanks. I don't want to go to crazy with you commanders having 12 crew skills per tank so I'm still trying to figure it all out but if you haven't tried it yet you are missing out!

We have seen our BA group grow and grow but there is plenty of room for more growth. Just between the Austin group and us in San Antonio, there are games going on about 4 times a week somewhere. I want to reach out to the Dallas and Houston groups by introducing city challenges, and battles at Millennium Con with people from Oklahoma and Louisiana. More to come so keep reading the LSHM newsletter and keep an eye on the Texas Bolt Action Facebook page for more information.

Finally, I want to thank Oscar Barela, Casey Pitman, and Charles Torok for their support and advice. Without their support, I'm sure that our BA group would not be nearly as fun and exciting as it is. So, as I used to tell my soldiers and airmen when I was on active duty, "Have fun and Charlie Mike (Continue Mission)!"

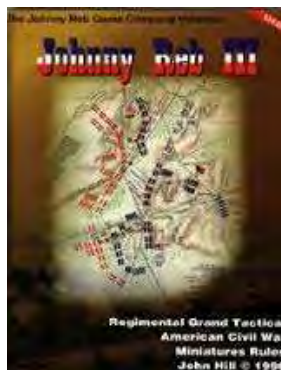
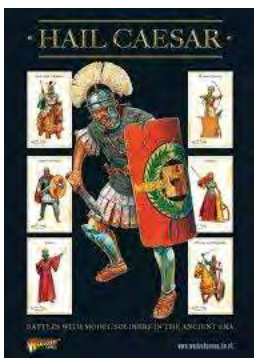

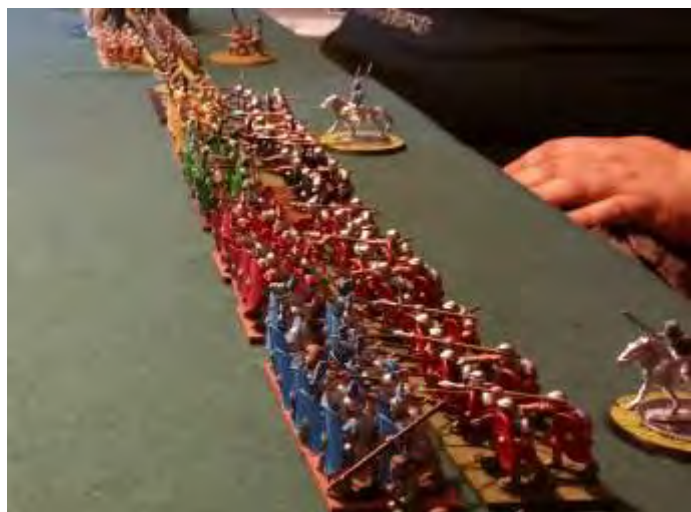
Sometimes you just want to play something larger than the skirmish level battles provided by SAGA – so enter Hail Caesar!

Several months ago a few of us in Austin started getting into this through some strategic (and lucky) bids on Ebay. From a small start, the group has some new Roman, Greek, Spartan, and “hairy barbarian” (can represent Germans, Celts, Gauls, or Britons) armies joining the battlefield.

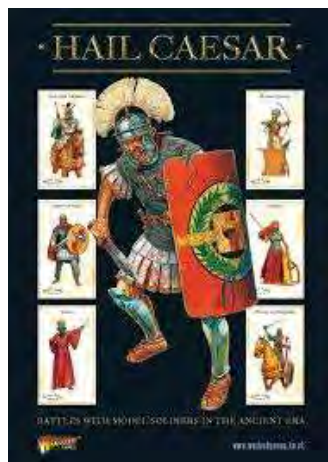
Over the course of a three learning games, we’ve covered the basic mechanics and seen the armies grow from 250 points per side, up through 500 points per side, with the goal of fielding 600 point armies for larger games. The game plays well with 4 players (each player commanding at least 2 divisions) and moves quickly even at larger sizes.

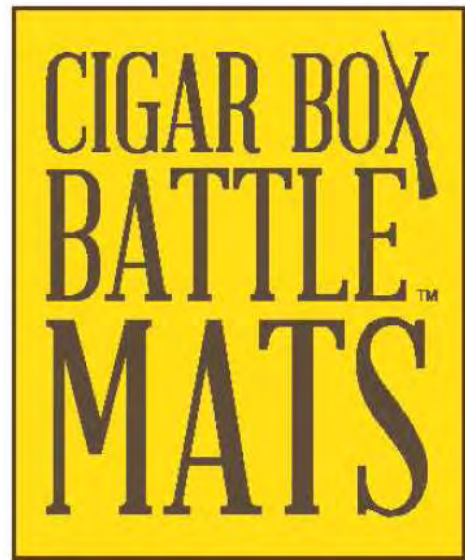


Table size and measurements have been subject to House Rules. The rules call for a larger table than most of us can support, but by playing on a 6 x 4 table and reducing all measurements in the game by 50% (i.e. a move of 6 inches reduces to 3 inches), things seem to work perfectly. I'd recommend using an 8 x 4 table once you start playing 500-600 point games, which with some plywood, is exactly what the house supports!



A quick word on minis. If you are not familiar with the Warlord Games line – the figures are great. Easy to assemble with a decent ability to customize, you can quickly build a large army. Not to be overlooked – Victrix Minis also has a nice line and makes up the bulk of my Greek Hoplites. If you are in the Austin area, you can find us on The Great Hall Games forum or track me down!

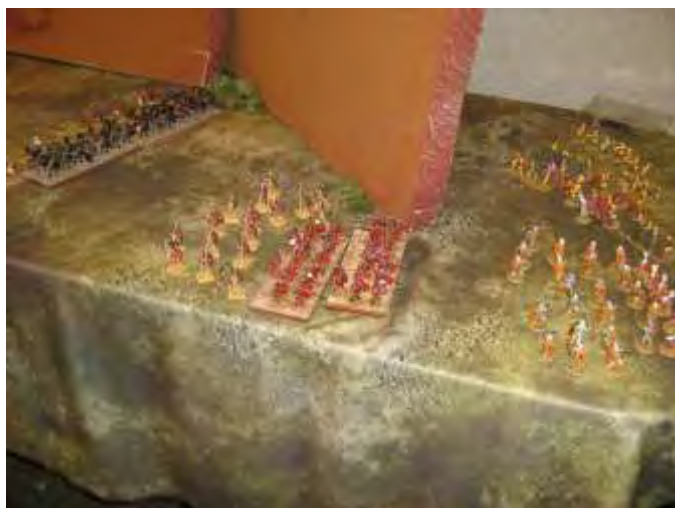

Look for us to announce an early March 2017 date soon.

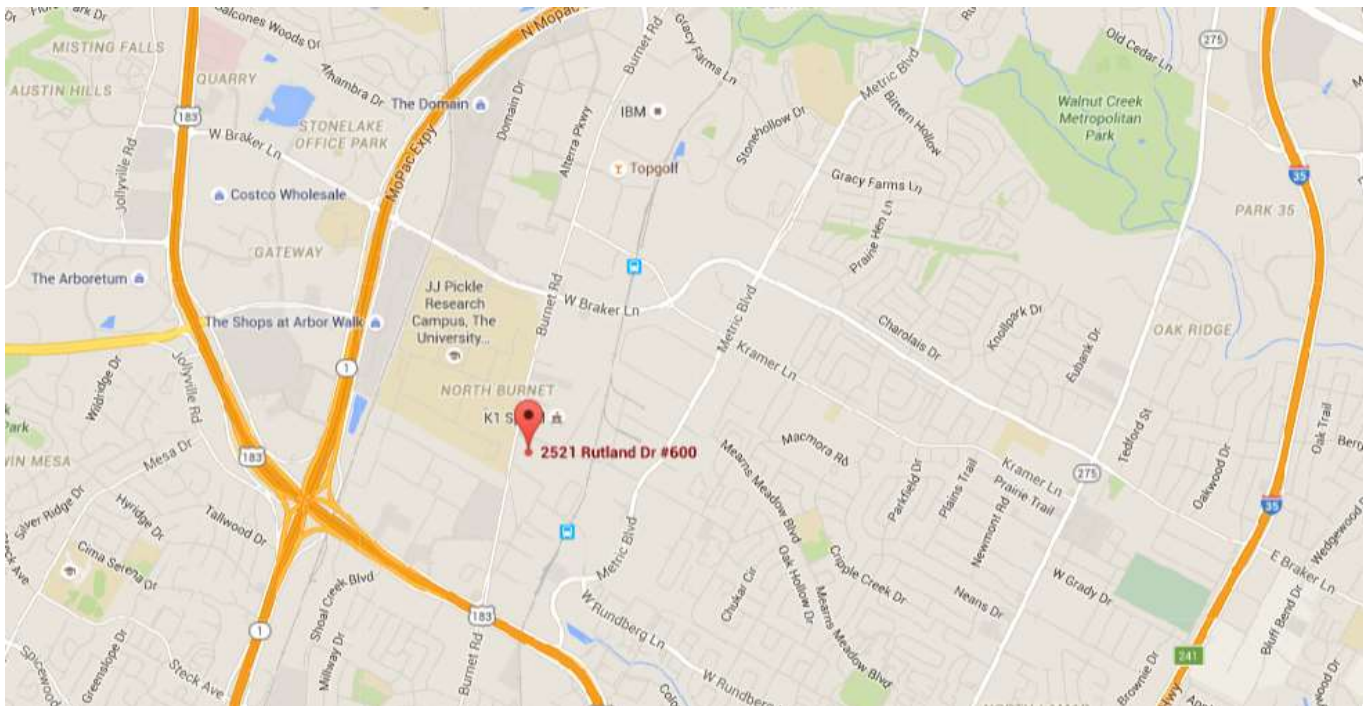

INTRODUCING THE ACW GAMER LINE OF 28MM MINIATURES

These figures are compatible with many popular miniature lines and will add color and character to your ACW collections or armies.



Our first release takes place on 6 April 1862 at the Battle of Shiloh. Confederate General Albert Sidney Johnston has launched a surprise attack on Union forces under General Grant massing on the banks of the Tennessee River. In the early stages of the battle, Confederates had overrun some of the Union camps and many had begun to loot the abandoned tents. Johnston spotted a Confederate officer with a arm full of the spoils of war and chastised him for his behavior. Observing how chastened the officer was, Johnston picked up a tin cup and declared it to be his part of the spoils.

Later, Johnston would wave the cup as he encouraged his men to launch an assault against stubborn Federals holding a position that would become known as "the Hornet's Nest." Johnston's men swept the position, but Johnston would receive a wound which, although would appear slight, would cause him to bleed out shortly after the attack on the Hornet's Nest. Historians speculate that this loss cost the South the leader it needed in the West to turn the tide of the war.

The 2016 FoWSA Tournaments

In 2016 we will not just have FoWSA11, the eleventh Flames of War San Antonio tournament; and Early FoWSA III, the third early war Flames of War San Antonio tournament.

We will have three FoWSAs: early, middle and late war!

Early FoWSA III – The early war tournament

March 12th, the second Saturday in March

1500 points, single list. ~~Deadline to get lists in: March 5th at noon, central time. Fee: \$15.~~

Middle FoWSA – The mid war tournament

July 9th, the second Saturday in July

1700 points, special 2nd list criteria. Deadline to get lists in: July 2nd at noon, central time. Fee: \$15

FoWSA 11 - The late war tournament

September 10th, the second Saturday in September

1420 points, special 2nd list criteria. Deadline to get lists in: September 3rd at noon. Fee: \$20

All three tournaments will be held in the Annex at Dragon's Lair Comics, 7959 Fredericksburg Rd # 129 San Antonio, Texas (Fredericksburg Rd and Medical Dr.). Space is limited, so first pre-registered, first served, after a point I'm taking stand-bys. Details on the FoWSA facebook group and blog.

Missions will be announced at sign-in.

Email lists to ian.straus@att.net with subject line "2016 FoWSA list".

Lists must be from Army books and official PDF lists available on line as of one month before each tournament. You must ask to use a PDF, there will be screening for balance. Heroes may be used, however when a specific Hero is killed, all lists using that hero immediately lose the hero in question for that round.

\$5 discount for LSHM members who pre-register. Tournament fees will be payable on the day of event at the door. Lunch (pizza) is included in the entry fee. On the day of the event, registration opens at 09:00 AM, pairing at 10:00 AM, and play begins at 10:15 AM. Expect play to continue until after 7PM.

Terrain will be appreciated, and in each tournament I will give a prize for the best table. (We provide the table, you provide everything on top of it.) Please tell me if you intend to participate in the terrain table contest, so that I may send you table criteria and forms.

Bolt Action Game Report: TANK WAR

Subject: Battle report 11 MAR 16 (Tank War for Bolt Action); 2 battles were fought

From: Leutnant Wicker, 3d Zug

To: Hauptman Von Villebois, 10th Kompanie GD, and Commanding

Enemy (Oscar and Marcilino at around a 1,000 points each): Russians from the 218th Tank regiment @ 5xT34/76s, 2xT34/85s, 1xSU 76, 1xBA10 AC, @ 3 enemy Anti-Tank Teams.

Friendly Forces (Carlos Sierra and me at around a 1,000 points each): 2xTiger 1s (2 and 3 Zug/10th Kompanie), GD; 4x PZR IVs Panzer Abteilung (PN. Abt) 302, GD

Situation: @ 1300 hours, 11 MAR, Russian tank forces advancing west towards Belsk (Russia) were intercepted near a bridge over the Psel River.



My platoon of 1 Tiger and 2 PZR IVs advanced SE towards the Psel River and the bridge alongside Oberleutnant Sierra's 2d Zug of 1 Tiger and 2 Pzr IVs. I saw dust behind the bridge and trees on the far side of the river and ordered Feldwebel Schmidt to advance over the bridge and recon the far side. His tank was struck at least three times and set on fire...sadly killing all them. 2d Zug broke to the right of the bridge and immediately started to engage at least three T34/76s and small AT teams. I broke left and setup an ambush position near the bank of the Psel River and covering the bridge.

The Russians advanced timidly, exchanging fire with us for about 30 minutes. This provided us a distinct advantage with our longer range and superior firepower. Two T34s (1 T34/76 and 1 T34/85) emerged on the road heading NW towards the bridge my two tanks destroyed them both. On the right flank, Sierra engaged with at least 4xT34/76s. The "Ivan" scum realized that we were getting the better of them and so they pressed their numerical superiority over the bridge starting with the BA10.



Bolt Action TANK WAR (continued)

The 2d Battle

HQs called 2d Zug away and reinforced my zug with two more PZR IVs. Some Ivan must have gotten shot, because the Russe came back at me with a VENGEANCE 2 hours later! 5xT34/76s stormed the bridge in a mad rush. Aligned side-by-side down the bridge they came. The audacity (and bravery) startled my zug as many of our rounds missed or bounced off the T34s as they charged. In less than 20 minutes, my Tiger and one PZR IV was destroyed (yes, Oscar penetrated my 10 frontal armor with a T34/76 at a medium range), and the third PZR IV retreated to safety to fight another day. I was able to destroy one T34 and immobilize another. The Bridge was left in Ivan's (Oscar's) hands.....for now.

Service & support: My Zug needs new tanks. Art Douglas sold me a Tiger Tank w/bad frontal armor. So I'll repair the front glacis and come back stronger than ever (just joking Art, I'm happy to have the Tiger in the San Antonio Bolt Action family).

Historical note: Oscar's charge was reminiscent of many tank battles fought in mid '43. The Russians had to close to within 300-500 meters to get killing hits (sometimes even ramming them) while the Germans were killing Russian Tanks at 1500-1800 meters! So, if you play Russians, buy lots of tanks and don't hold back but then CHARGE FORWARD!



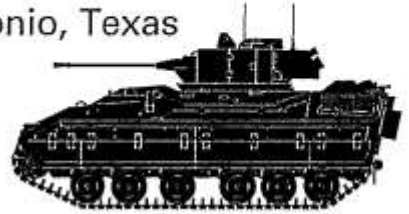

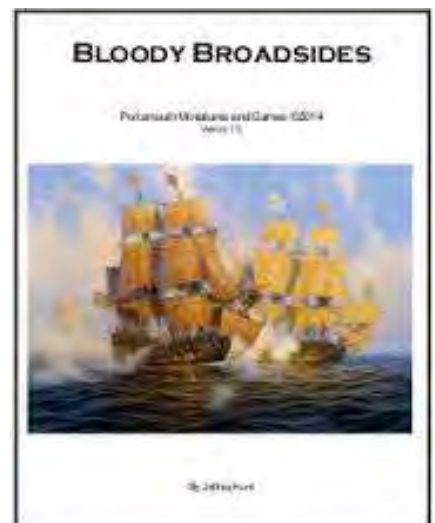
