The Partisans I'm playing with are mainly veterans, not some inexperienced Joe off the street. There are enough right now for about 700ish points.



Once I have enough models, I'm going to play with a cavalry squad that will have a total of ten models including the NCO. These are the three that I've finished so far.

Last, there are the partisans that are being painted up. I felt like there should be a flag bearer (even if you can't get one). This model *had* a molotov cocktail, but with some clippers, toothpick, and a printed out flag, the grenade was no more. If you thought the Japanese and the Soviets were the only ones with cool flags, you got it wrong! Since the Home Army was betrayed by the Soviets when they rounded them up, they can easily fight either the Germans or the Soviets. Fritz, Ivan, beware, the Home Army is here!

The San Antonio Muster II gave me an opportunity to bring out a game that hadn't seen daylight in years. Thanks to some prodding by Charlie to play something we don't often see I broke out (and dusted off) some GHQ WWII Micro-Armour along with the game of the same name. And yes, that is how they spell armour even if it does give me the red squiggly line.



Based on a rather flimsy, "what if" scenario I put together what I hoped was a pair of balanced forces consisting of lots of the sexy tanks we all love from WWII. The Germans had some PzKw Mk IVs, some Tigers and some Panthers. The US got a selection of tank hunters (M-10s, M-18s and M-36 Jacksons) along with various Shermans from the old reliable 75 to the massive Jumbo.

Connor S (my son) and Steven D. fielded the US forces while David B took care of the German armor. The US forces deployed swiftly and easily as communications were passed up and down the line. The Germans came on in a sporadic wave. The game is all about cohesion rolls and if you roll poorly you either miss hitting your target or fail to understand that you need to kick your tank into gear. The first few turns went quickly as the US dug into the woods and the Germans took their time advancing. Shots were eventually fired and the Germans started doing some damage but Connor's forces manage to take some withering fire and still survive. Steve redeployed some Shermans at high speed to help Connor hold his flank. David advanced as he realized he needed to close the distance to do more damage, but exposed his side armor to US forces that could actually hurt him.



The last couple turns were bloody. The US needed 3 more kills to effectively break the Germans and they piled in on a few unlucky tanks, taking out two Panthers and a MkIV. The Germans had a shot at evening things up but David was hindered by a few more bad rolls and the US ended up scoring the victory. David won the roll off for the gift card so everyone won in the end. All in all I think the game went very smoothly and I hope everyone had a good time.

Hail Caesar 28mm Rome vs Carthage By Charlie Torok

Four of us tried out Hail Caesar by Warlord Games as an introductory game. I had played one full battle prior to the Muster so we used this game as a test game. This battle pitted the Romans against the Carthaginians, each player commanded 6 elements. The Carthaginians were led by Mark Leroux and James Amecucci and the Romans by myself and Scott Synowiez. We had a great time “teaching” ourselves the rules. The first few turns took some time but after we got used to the mechanics of the rules it went pretty smooth. We had a good time using the various types of troops and their capabilities – everything from small javelin armed skirmishers, Elephants, heavy and light cavalry and of course the mainstay of the ancient world – the heavy infantry.

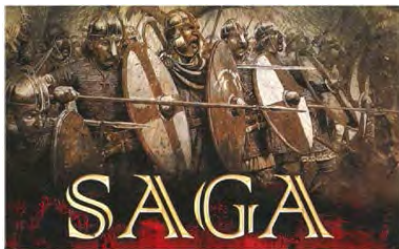

Vikings vs Pagan Rus Battle at the Ford

The battle saw the Pagans get out to an early head start by pushing a large group across one of the fords, but they were

then stalled by a large group of Viking archers and some warriors. At the other ford, the Vikings mounted a strong push and wiped out a group of Pagan Rus before forcing their way across the ford. A battle on the last turn between the opposing warlords sealed up a Viking win, with their warlord, several Hearthguard, and a group of warriors on the Rus side of the river.

Two opposing warbands clash over a small settlement seeking only to wipe out "the other guys". In a see-saw battle, both sides tore into one another. The Viking gods saw to it that the Dane hearthguard, the cream of their army, took unexpectedly heavy losses, but the balance of the Danes held out - including defending from a building against a Berserker attack. In the end, the Anglo-Danes cut down the Viking warlord and defeated Odin's Chosen Few.

Fatigued but holding a good position in the center, the Saxons sought to hold off the Spanish cavalry and a group of mercenaries. The Spanish warlord was a religious advisor and was determined to kill the Saxons to a man. Taking advantage of the "unlimited warband" provision, the Spanish pressed in relentlessly and picked off Saxons with javelins and swords alike. The Saxons held strong on their large units (7 points of warriors formed into groups of 12), and them lashed out once the Spanish were close. In a bloody turn, over a dozen Spaniards fell to the hearty Saxon infantry. This likely saved the Saxon cause, as it forced the Spanish to regroup, before attacking again. The Spanish were up against a turn limit and needed to kill EVERY Saxon except the warlord for the win. As the battle ended, the Saxon warlord was chopped down in a frenzied attack, but enough of his men survived to call the near run battle a win.

Bolt Action Battle Report

Battle report for the 2d BN Commander,
Grossdeutschland from Commander B Company, 2d BN, GD.
Date: 24 July 1940

Situation: A Junker 87 carrying LTC Mueller and the plans for 7th Corps to invade France through the lowland countries crashed near elements of the British 3rd INF Div. B company, 2d BN was ordered to recover the officer and plans.



B company (-) with a PZR IV and one Kradschutzen from the Recon Company in support. In Addition, 1 flame thrower team from the Pioneer company. The company (-) contained 4 squads, 2 MMG teams, and one SDKFZ 251/c.



Post battlefield analysis suggests that the British ORBAT contained: 1 Matilda, 2 Bren Carriers, 4 Squads, 2 MMGs, an Arty Observer, and an ATR team.

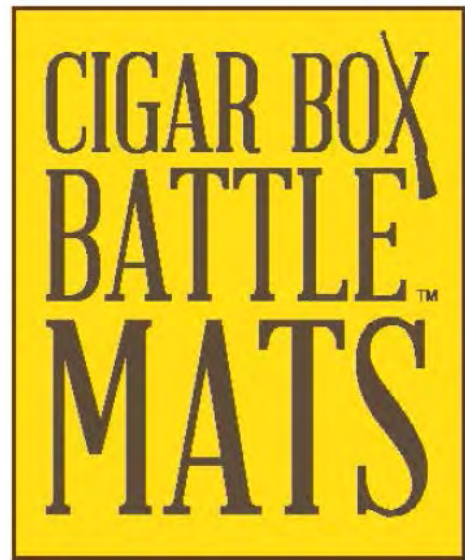
Apparently both forces discovered the downed officer simultaneously near a hamlet East of St Vith, Belgium. My force was spread out so I ordered them to concentrate to the hamlet. I ordered the first 2 squads that arrived to establish a covering position over the officer on a wooded hill East of the hamlet, and one squad and a MMG into a Cafe in the Hamlet. The PZR IV arrived and immediately destroyed a Vickers MMG team. I ordered the Halftrack carrying the flamethrower and one squad to secure the officer but overwhelming fire power from three squads and 2 Bren carriers forced them to retreat behind the hill. 45 minutes after initial contact, one British squad was able to capture the officer. The British center was too strong so shifted my forces to flank the British left.



Accurate British firepower destroyed the Kradschutzen and the 2d Squad in the hamlet. The flame thrower team jammed the flame thrower during it's attack on a 2d MMG on our right flank so 4th Squad close assaulted it and destroyed it.

Although, the British captured the officer they failed to act on their profound luck. Intelligence reports indicate that the BEF and French forces have not moved to block our next attack.....

HaT Industrie 28mm El Cid range - My next SAGA project.

I picked up a box of HaT 28mm El Cid Andalusian Light Cavalry for my SAGA (Crescent and the Cross) Saracens project at Dibbles Hobbies here in San Antonio. HaT normally produces 1/72 and 1/35 scale soft plastics, but they have experimented with 28mm hard plastic ranges (El Cid and Napoleonic). The figures are pretty inexpensive (\$15 for 12 mounted figures) so I bought a box and painted them up to see how they looked.



I was pretty happy with the overall quality and detail. I am planning to build a basic 6 point SAGA army with a mounted Warlord, 3 x 8 mounted warriors w/bows and 3 x 8 mounted warriors with spear/sword + shields. My goal is to have this army completed and ready for battle at the Great Hall Games SAGA tournament on 28 August.

These first six are mounted archers, I painted all 12 horses and then moved on to the Saracens. I finished the horse archers first and am now working on the warriors with hand weapons. I plan to include a leader and banner for each warrior band, this should add some nice color to the force.

One picture below includes a Warlord Pike and Shotte mounted Dragoon for size comparison - they match up nicely with other 28mm figures. Next up is basing them - and buying another 4 boxes!!!!

I have been using the metal bases provided by War Games Accessories for many years now. The owner, Mr. Jeff Lista, provides a great service and product.

I use Jeff's metal stands on the bottom of all my wargame bases. I then line my shelf drawers with magnetic sheets – typically the 8 ½ x 11 ones you can find at Joann Fabrics. Once the metal bottoms are in place they stick nicely to the magnetic drawers. These then store nicely or transport without figures / bases moving around. This keeps figures from being damaged. I also mount washers on my individual figures to keep them from moving when stored or transported
