Balloon Busting Playtest



Destroy that Balloon!

At 0430 hours, 27 September 1918, the American Expeditionary Force (AEF) launched the Meuse-Argonne offensive against German Army Group Gallwitz.

The US 1st Air Service was tasked with attacking German ground units and destroying their observation balloons. Pilots of the 27th Aero Squadron were ordered to destroy the German balloon near the town of Varennes.

An American force of 2 Nieuport 28s and 2 SPAD XIIIs attacked the balloon. The Germans countered with 2 Fokker D.VIIs and 2 Fokker Dr.1s.

The Americans fighting through the Germans, destroyed the balloon, but at a heavy cost. The balloon exploded destroying two US planes, which were too close. German AA shot down a third plane. The fourth plane was destroyed in a collision with an enemy plane. The Germans meanwhile lost two planes. One plane was shot down in a dogfight and the other destroyed in a collision.

Bayou Battles Bolt Action

After Action Report

August 11-12, 2018



The second Bayou Battles Bolt Action event was another successful endeavor, with players from Baton Rouge and all over Texas coming together for a weekend of WWII miniature mayhem. Just like last year, we ran two separate 3-game tournaments—a 20-player 1250 point National Qualifiers event on Saturday, and a 14-player 700 point event on Sunday. We had several players making their tournament debuts, with a very diverse group of players ranging in age from the mid-teens to retirees. Like last year, there was a mix of both book scenarios and some specially made for our event, but in any case, players needed to think on their feet.



In addition to giving away prizes to the best General on the Allied and Axis sides each day, we decided to do something a little more fun and different this year. We also gave out prizes for players that did the best (or worst, in some cases) in meeting certain criteria over the course of the weekend. These categories included the Most Knocked out Vehicles, Most Officer Kills, Most FUBARs, Most Friendly Fire Deaths, Lowest Successful Morale Test, and Greatest Outnumbered Victorious Assault. We also gave out a prize to the best painted army of the weekend and a sportsmanship award to the favorite opponent of the weekend. Several players also brought some amazing terrain for us to use and set up 8 amazing looking tables for everyone to play on. The players had a chance to vote for their favorite table, with the highest vote getter winning a prize. Just like last year, no one walked away empty handed, and everyone had a something to take home at the end of the weekend.



Saturday's event saw all players playing the same scenarios in each of the three rounds, with match ups, as much as possible set up as Axis v. Allies. (We had more Allies though...I guess everyone wanted to play on the winning side!). It was a fun-filled 3 rounds, but when the dust settled at the end of the day, Jacob Mayer's Soviets were left as the Overall Winner and Best Allied General. Bill Bodin's Japanese ended up as the Best Axis General (3rd overall).



Sunday's event saw the first 2 rounds being played as Attacker-Defender scenarios, with each person getting a chance to play each side, with different scenarios attached to the tables. The third round everyone played the same objective-based scenario. After the three rounds were played, Matt Bizzell's Desert Rats came out as the Overall Winner and Best Allied General, with Phil Vernon's Italians taking home Best Axis General (3rd overall). Matt's impressive showing for the weekend—2nd overall (2nd Best Allied General) on Saturday and 1st overall on Sunday—won him the Field Marshal of the Bayou award for the best combined performance for the weekend. Bill Seirich's US Marines however did not fare so well. While he did manage to win his final game on Sunday, he (unfortunately) won the General Jay MacKelvie award for the...um...least effective general for the weekend.

Due to the generosity of our sponsors, including Warlord Games, Rubicon Models, Sherwood Games (Baton Rouge, LA), Goldmine Games (Richmond, TX), and Trenchworx, we had many prizes to give away. Charles Pecquet is a master modeler and painter, walking away with not only the Best Painted army of the weekend (US Army), but also the Best Table award as voted on by the players (narrowly beating out Chris Cassaday and Phil Medick). Phil Vernon won the Best Sportsmanship award in a tie-breaker over 2 other players (highest battle points was used as the tie-breaker, because if you can make your opponent smile while you are punching him in the gut, you are doing something right!). Tanton Johnson won the Tank Buster award (most knocked out vehicles), and Bill Bodin won the Assassin award for most Officer Kills. 3 players tied for most FUBARs (Bill Anders, Chris Cassaday, and Evan Hoy with 3 each), but Josh Burks won infamy for managing to kill 6 of his own men over the course of the weekend. The Insane Courage award for lowest successful morale check went to Matt Bohan, who successfully kept a unit alive when needing to roll a 3, and Brad Williams won the Berserker Assault award for having a 4-man SS squad take out a full 12-man unit of Soviets (outnumbered 3:1).



Overall it was a successful weekend of Bolt Action gaming. Tournament games test a player's abilities in ways that leagues and historical battle recreations cannot. Preparing a set army list that can tackle a variety of unknown scenario objectives and against unknown foes, time limits on games making you think faster on your feet, and not only learning to be flexible with your tactics and strategies, but also learning new tricks from your opponents can be a fun way to add a little variety to your hobby time and expand your knowledge of the game. Seeing gorgeously painted armies and amazing tables can inspire you to create your own visually stunning games. Plus, the chance to play against new opponents and armies than you normally play and developing friendships and friendly rivalries against players from other cities make it worth the time and expense of attending events such as Bayou Battles.





I want to thank all the players for making the weekend a fun event (with thankfully few rules disputes for me to rule on). The success of the past two Bolt Action events at Bayou Battles is encouraging enough to ensure it will return next year. We will likely be making some minor changes to emphasize that the enjoyment of the games being played is more important than which army stands victorious at the end. Bayou Battles normally takes place the first or second weekend in August, so keep an eye out on our website (bayoubattles.com) or like our Bayou Battles Facebook page to keep abreast of next year's event as the details get ironed out over the coming months.

Bolt Action Tournament Report

Pacific Tournament summary:

Armed Forces Radio Network proudly announces that the Allies have secured island footholds in the Pacific and mainland China against Axis forces!



The battles were hard fought but the tenacity of the several Russian forces such as Leytenant Jacob Mayer's company (-) from the 57th Rifle Division, and elements from the U.S. Marine Corps lead by 1LT Robert Williams attacked with great tenacity. 8 PLT leaders faced off in a Pacific themed event. The victory point totals were 113 for the allies and 65 for the axis. Best allied leader went to platoon leader (PLT LDR) Jacob Mayer (40 points) followed by Nate Brakel (31 points), and the best Axis PLT LDR went to Nathaniel Culver (21 points) commanding elements from the DAK, and Art Douglas (19 points) commanding elements from the Japanese Army.

The terrain was spread over 4 tables in which 2 where heavy jungle and 2 where urban environments. The rail station was a dense map and the opposing forces had to close in till they could see the "whites of their eyes" to score good shots. Because of this, there were some great "in your face" fighting. 2LT Oscar Barela faced 1LT Andrew Fisher's Chinese in fierce fighting from rail cars and the engine house. 2LT Barela lead wave after wave of banzai charges while 1LT Fisher held on to mow them down. 1LT Williams and his Marines fought in the dense jungle over an obscure village with 1LT Art Douglas. 1lt Douglas sent waves of infantry at the hard pressed Marines but 1LT Williams was able to hold his ground, and the objectives, for a win.



During the first round, the mission was to kill as many of the enemy as possible. Torrential rain arrived at turn 3 which limited line of sight (LOS) to 12". Many an officer grumbled but all of them fought determinedly. With a limited field of view, they were forced to rethink their strategy since their long range weapons were limited. 1Lt Brakel's Brits performed well against Art's Japanese fighting in the railyard. Nate was humble though by stating that, "I just got lucky." Between 1LT Williams Marines and Obersturmfueher (Osturm) Silliman, the rain had a dramatic impact. With time running out, Silliman raced his panzer II out front to get a good LOS and ran right into a marine flamethrower team. Although the panzer was immobilized, the crew held firm and continued the fight which effectively stopped the Marines.



Again, I re-learned some rules (for example, a full squad gets to re-roll a failed morale check). I like to use special rules in my tournaments to add a twist or something different. Torrential rain, Sand/snow storm, and mine fields add a uniqueness that every commander must face in a real life situation. These dynamics force PLT LDRs to think “outside the box” and do something special to accomplish the mission.





Finally, 8 PLT leaders formed 4 teams in this team tournament. I will continue to encourage gamers to learn history behind the units they represent by awarding points for a platoon/company/battalion level short written reports. As usual, the points made a difference in placing in the tournament. Only one LT decided to submit and he won the event! I encourage everyone to invest the time to research their unit for a few extra points; they may make a difference. It is fun and I get to learn something behind the forces I referee.



In conclusion, I want to thank Dragons Lair for hosting and sponsoring this tournament. If you are ever in San Antonio, you would do well to stop by Dragon's Lair and introduce yourself to Cliff and his staff while shopping the wonders of his store.



The next tournament is tentatively scheduled at Dragons Lair, SA on 27 OCT 18 and it will be themed for North Africa and the Mediterranean to support the new release of the Western Campaign book; more info to follow shortly on Facebook. I encourage you to keep up the great BA camaraderie as we see more people become PLT leaders. Join me in bringing new people and teaching them the fun and excitement of Bolt Action. Get your forces ready for the North African deserts in the next tourney. Sarge.....OUT.
